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

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GHCA Boat Ramp Rules

NEW FOR 2024

Requirements to lease a 2024 GHCA Boat Ramp Key

- 1. Proof of ownership in Gulf Harbors or long-term rental (must show a lease with 6 months+ remaining on it from the date you apply to lease the key.)
- 2. A current 2024 GHCA membership card.
- 3. A current picture ID (driver's license, passport, government issued ID, or military ID)
- 4. You must be 21 years of age or older.
- A completed and signed Boat Ramp Key Holder Acceptance of Rules and Regulations and the Release and Waiver of Liability form.
- The return of your leased 2023 GHCA Boat Ramp Key, if applicable (failure to return last year's key may result in a \$100 fine plus the security deposit and lease fee for the current year).
- 7. Contractors must supply a Certificate of Insurance and business license.
- 8. The corresponding fee(s) paid (see below).

2024 FEES

1. Security Deposit: \$10.00. This is applicable to all GHCA Boat Ramp Key applicants.

Upon return of your previously leased GHCA Boat Ramp Key, the prior year's security deposit will be used towards the security deposit for the current year's GHCA Boat Ramp Key lease.

2. Boat Ramp Key Lease Fees:

A. Homeowner/Long Term Renter: \$ 40.00 B. Homeowner Contractor: \$500.00

C. Homeowner Advertising on

AirBNB or VRBO: \$500.00

D. Outside Contractor: \$750.00

Membership: One-time Opening: \$100.00

Proper Pet Waste Disposal


Pasco County is asking pet owners to do their part by collecting their pet's waste and properly disposing of it.

When pet waste is left on the ground, stormwater runoff carries the bacteria and nutrients into waterways. This waste runoff contributes to algae blooms and unhealthy conditions for fish and wildlife. Polluted waters are also unsafe for swimming and recreation.

Keep Pasco County's waterways clean by disposing of your pet waste in the trash. Violations can result in a \$150 fine.

The Boater's Corner By Captains Bruce and Wendy Longman

The season is almost upon us, and perhaps you are thinking of buying a new boat or repowering with a new engine.

When you buy a brand new boat or engine, you want to really take the time to read the entire manual before you put the boat in the water. It's been our experience that when you break in your engine right by following the manufacturer's directions, you'll get the peak performance and longevity out of your motor.

You want to do everything you can to maximize the soundness of your engine, because it is a machine and the break-in period can affect the overall performance and durability of that machine.

We want to stress that the first hour is super critical, along the next two hours after that. During those first three hours you want to really concentrate on following the manufacturer's instructions for that particular engine model, and once you get past those first three hours, you're out of the woods and you just need to stay off that top end speed for the next seven to ten hours.

If you break it in right, you'll have the fastest, strongest engine with the best fuel economy it can produce. It's the one thing that you can do for it that will maximize everything that engine can do to get the peak performance out of it during its lifetime.

Why do you need to break in an outboard motor?

- You're checking out the motor to make sure there's no issues
- Allowing the engine to lubricate
- Scrubbing off any machining grooves
- Allow internal parts to "seat"

The break in process may vary slightly by manufacturer, be sure to reference the owners manual for your new motor before you put your boat in the water and begin the process.

But here is the typical method (taken from Yamaha Outboard Manual):

For the first hour: Run engine at varying speeds up to no more than 2000 RPM.

For the second hour: Power up just enough to put the boat on plane and then back off enough to remain on plane. This should be no more than half throttle. Vary the RPMs.

Remaining 8 hours: Operate the engine while varying the RPMs between ½ and ¾ throttle. You may occasionally use full throttle but do not operate the engine continuously at full throttle for more than five minutes. After ten hours operate normally.

Greek Style Chicken with Lemon Butter Sauce

4 boneless chicken breasts

2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1 teaspoon dry oregano

½ cup chopped sundried tomatoes

½ cup Nikos crumbled feta cheese

2 tablespoon fresh basil chopped

3 tablespoons butter

½ cup lemon juice

½ cup cream

1/4 teaspoon sea salt

In a small bowl toss together feta cheese, sundried tomatoes, basil set aside.

Coat chicken breast well with olive oil and season with oregano. On stove top on medium heat add chicken breast to a non-stick grill pan cook chicken approximately 5 to 6 minutes on each side or until chicken is no longer pink in the middle.

In a small sauce pan on medium high heat add butter, lemon, cream and salt whisk until butter is melted and sauce is heated through and has thicken a bit.

Top each chicken breast with equal amount of sundried tomato mixture and lemon sauce. 4 boneless chicken breasts

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1 teaspoon dry oregano

½ cup chopped sundried tomatoes

½ cup Nikos crumbled feta cheese

2 tablespoon fresh basil chopped

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In a small sauce pan on medium high heat add butter, lemon, cream and salt whisk until butter is melted and sauce is heated through and has thicken a bit.

Top each chicken breast with equal amount of sundried tomato mixture and lemon sauce.

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

The GHYC Supports "Pack a Sack"



Happy Spring 2024! Something is rising in Gulf Harbors and it's not the waters! It's the inventory! We have quickly moved from a seller's market to a "balanced" or normal market where neither the sellers nor the buyers have an advantage — a fair playing

field. That said, with almost 7 months of inventory (and rising), unless something else unexpected happens like a sudden seasonal surge in demand or a decrease in interest rates, we could be moving towards a buyers' market. The stats below tell the story of the homes that have sold so far this year. The SOLD homes were on the market an average of 65 days (DOM); the median 40. This is considered in the "normal" range. A look at the 46 Active properties tells another story, of those on the market today, the average DOM is 119 and the median 105. So the Active listings are remaining on the market twice as long as the sold properties! Of the 7 homes currently PENDING SALE, the average DOM is 46 with a median at just 14. What does this tell you? Homes that are priced correctly for their location, condition and amenities are selling within the normal range. Others are still trying to find their sweet spot in pricing, in fact, 76% of the Active Gulf Harbors listings have made price adjustments since going on the market, 26 adjusted their price in the last 7 days! It's the best time of the year to get your house on the market as sales historically remain strong from now until the fall. Just remember that now is not the best time to "test the market" if you want to sell quickly. Price it right, and consider it SOLD!
