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Boat Ramp Rules

The two boat ramps in Gulf Harbors are owned by the Gulf Harbors Civic Association and maintained for the benefit of our membership.

The <u>North Channel Ramp</u>, off Bowline Bend, has a steep incline and is suitable for all size boats. <u>Recommended use at High Tide</u>.

The South Channel Ramp near the intersection of Floramar Terrace and Topsail Trail can always be used, but it is **better suited for use at Mid to High Tide**.

To schedule a ramp opening, contact one of the following Official Key Holders. They are volunteers. Please give them a minimum of 1 HOUR notice. You can call, or text them for easier contact.

PLEASE NOTE: The best time to launch boats from the South Channel boat ramp is between HALF and HIGH TIDE.

The following regulations apply to all ramp users:

- Use is <u>Restricted to Daylight</u> hours only.
- A current GHCA membership card must be presented to gain access along with boat registration in the cardholder's name and current driver's license. Must be 21 years of age or older.

NO EXCEPTIONS!!

- 3. Non-members will be charged \$100.00 (in advance) for each opening of the ramp.
- 4. Do not use your engines to load or unload boats.
- Bring your own helpers. It is not the responsibility of the key holders to assist you in launching or retrieving your boat.
- 6. If you intend to use the boat ramp frequently, a key may be leased from the GHCA Office for your personal use. Keys are \$40.00 plus a \$10.00 security deposit (GHCA members only). Please inquire at the GHCA Office for the requirements to lease a key.
 - The leased key is only to be used by the authorized GHCA member.
- 7. Ramp locks are changed January 5th of each year.
- 8. Please report any misuse of the boat ramps to the GHCA Office or the Boat Ramp Supervisor, Frank Rose at 401-447-0996.





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From the Desk of Public Relations

We are now in the middle of summer, so just a few reminders as we enjoy our great community:

- 1. House numbers are required near the primary entrance. There are still many homes without proper house numbers to identify them. You know who you are, don't wait for code enforcement to catch up with you.
- 2. County code does not permit motorhomes, campers, trailers, etc. to be stored in front of the residence. Our deed restrictions in most areas do not allow these vehicles anywhere else on the property, except in a garage. County code does allow motorhomes to be parked for no more than 3 days at a time to allow for loading or cleaning, but for no more than 4 times a year.
- 3. For new construction and remodels, plans must be submitted to the Architectural Review Committee. You can email them directly to me at publicrelations@gulfharbors.com for quicker response.
- 4. We have speed limit indicators on Floramar to remind you of the 30 MPH limit, so please respect that. There are more of us on the streets in the bicycle lanes now.

Insurance Legislator Letter

We are all acutely aware of the huge increase in insurance costs this year, plus some companies are requiring additional coverages, such as wind and flood, to even write a property casualty policy at all. Some of this is due to the exit of several insurance companies from Florida. We need our legislators to come up with plans to turn this around and help struggling homeowners. To that end, below is a draft of a letter that you can use to express your concerns. The GHCA is planning to host a town hall meeting with our Florida state representative, so you can sign this letter, or prepare one of your own, and drop it off at the GHCA office, and we will present them to our representative all at once.

Dear Florida Legislators,

Thank you for your time and consideration.

I am writing to you on behalf of the residents of the Gulf Harbors community located in New Port Richey, Florida regarding our concerns about the escalating insurance rates for flood and home insurance. The residents of Gulf Harbors, consisting largely of retired individuals who live on fixed incomes, are facing unfathomable costs and expenses that continue to rise each year.

As our representative, we request your help in curbing these rising insurance costs so that our community can maintain its sustainability. For many of our residents, the high insurance rates are rendering their homes unaffordable to maintain. This puts many of them at risk of losing their homes and their right to live in the community that they call home.

We urge you to take immediate action towards addressing these issues and finding sustainable solutions that are affordable for our residents. Please help us in preserving our community at Gulf Harbors, a place where residents can live out their retirement years without facing financial burdens.

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
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The Boater's Corner By Captains Bruce and Wendy Longman

Just as there are unspoken rules on land, there are certain customs that boaters should follow to be good neighbors to others on the water and nearby marine life. Having respect for your fellow sea-loving captains is the best way to avoid conflicts and even make some new friends while enjoying quality time on your vessel. Here are a few reminders to make sure your boating etiquette is in tip-top-shape:

Watch your wake: You're responsible for making sure that your wake isn't causing harm to your fellow boaters. Not only can big wakes in small, crowded places be dangerous, it's a definite way to anger your neighbors. Be sure to respect the wake rules to keep marine life and everyone else on the water safe and sound.

Move along: Whether you are on a fuel dock or boating ramp, be efficient. Delegate tasks and be prepared so that you can get out of the way of others and out on the water.

Slow down if another boat is trying to overtake you. If there's room to safely pass another vessel coming alongside you, ease off the throttle and avoid a drag race. The faster your speed, the faster they'll have to go to get around you. Just slow down and let them go around.

Lend a hand: This is one of the unwritten laws that can say more about you as a boater than almost anything else. You should be willing to assist other vessels as they arrive and depart with their anchors or lines. It just takes a minute, and you've shown everyone what a standup boater you are.

Respect your neighbors: If you have blasting music and lots of loud friends onboard, be courteous to others on the water and leave plenty of space. Sound carries much farther on the water, and you can be heard clearly from a good distance away. Downwind is your friend.

Keep it tidy: No matter if you're at the marina or sandbar, be sure to clean up your space and pick up all of your trash, dock lines, and equipment. Your neighbors and local animals will appreciate a clean, hazard-free space.

As a responsible boat owner, you're probably aware of the unspoken boating etiquette rules, but everyone could use a reminder! When you have guests onboard, be sure to teach them the proper boating manners so that you can have a happy and conflict-free day. Don't forget, email your questions to bruce@windsongcharters.com. 



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August Facts

August was once the sixth month of the year. In the original ten-month Roman calendar, the month went by the name of Sextilis, meaning "the sixth month" in Latin. It wasn't until around 700BC that August was rudely shoved back in the order of months when January and February were added to the beginning of the year by King Numa Pompilius.

August has also changed its number of days multiple times. In the ten-month Roman calendar, the months all had either 30 or 31 days, totaling 304 days in the year. Not only did Pompilius add January and February to the calendar, but he also reduced the number of days in August down to 29. It wasn't until Julius Caesar introduced the Julian calendar that it was left with 31 days, and it's stayed the same ever since!

August is also a little bit unique, most of the time at least. In a standard year, there is no other month that begins on the same day of the week as August. In a leap year, however, August begins on the same day of the week as February.

On August 6, 1762, the first-ever sandwich was created, at least with such a name. It was named after the Earl of Sandwich when he requested a dish involving meat between two pieces of bread. As the story goes, he requested it as he was in the middle of a gambling game and didn't want to interrupt it.

August also has two birth flowers – the vibrant multicolored gladiolus and the deep crimson poppy. The gladiolus flower is said to represent generosity, strength of character, and deep sincerity. The poppy flower couldn't be more different though, as it is a sign of imagination, eternal sleep, and oblivion!



Hello Gulf Harbors! Welcome to the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer. It's so hot outside no one wants to be outside or out of the pool, however, despite all that, real estate is still moving in Gulf Harbors! Inventory remains low at just 18 homes on the market today, last month there were 19 Active properties. Pending sales have dropped dramatically, last month there were 17 Pending Sale and this month, just 8. Closed sales rose to 53 YTD, or roughly 9 homes sold per month on the average, which is actually "pretty average" for GH sales. Last year on average only 7.25 sold per month, so we are tracking towards an increase in year over year sales. Monthly inventory dropped slightly, at 2.4 months, we are still in a very strong seller's market, except in homes priced over \$1M. While the average price per square foot and average sale price dropped slightly last month, the List to Sale Price ratio increased a point and the Days on Market went down a bit, so we are liking that trend. It would appear that the spiraling out of control insurance costs haven't dissuaded many buyers, who must consider it the price of living in paradise. That said, we recommend you join the GHCA campaign to blanket our representatives' email and mailboxes with letters expressing our concerns. There is no doubt that some people may be forced out of their homes if these prices continue to rise. Let us know if you'd like a copy of the letter!

The reality in the housing market right now is how few homes there are for sale compared to the number of people who want to buy them. According to a recent report from Realtor.com: "On average, active inventory in June was 50.6% below pre-pandemic 2017–2019 levels." What that means is with supply so low, if you are thinking of selling, now may be a great time to make a move!
